Research shows that Colorado 4-H youth are more socially competent and more likely than other youth to develop practical skills needed to become more capable and contributing adults. They are more likely:


- To be able to speak with ease in front of others

Ice Breaker Activity

Have the group break off into pairs and give them a piece of paper, pencil and a picture (animal, mountain, house, etc.). The members will sit back-to-back and one person will be given the paper and pencil and the other the picture. Note: It's important that only one of the partners sees the picture. The person with the picture will describe what they see to the other partner and the partner will draw what is described to them. This exercise will help them with understanding the importance of communication and how sometimes the little details are the most important.

GOAL SETTING (page 2)

Goals are a great way to challenge yourself as you look forward in your 4-H project. Be sure all your goals are SMART: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Timely. By using SMART goals you will be able to look back at the end to determine if you reached the goals you set for yourself. Simply stating "I want to become a better cake decorator" for example does not fall into a SMART goal as there would not be an easy way to measure if you met that goal. Instead you could say "I want to decorate 4 different cakes to increase my decorating skills." At the end of the year you could easily look back to see if you did decorate 4 cakes and if you increased skills as you went through your project.

PROJECT EXPENSES AND INCOME/VALUE (page 3)

This section is designed for you to record all of the expenses required for your project. You will want to list any tools, equipment or supplies purchased for use with your projects this year. Some people will list each item separately and that is acceptable, while others will lump all the items together and give one cost.

Here is a suggestion of what you might consider when thinking about expenses of your project:

- 5/10/24 Transportation fuel cost for project meetings purchasing supplies, tools, etc.
- 3/9/24 Supplies items needed to complete the project

Example: The Foods project may want to figure the cost on a batch of cookies and then divide that by the number of cookies to get the individual cost for the project.

Only include the cost of items purchased this year. If you already have a camera, then the project cost would be the film and film developing. You may add sheets as necessary to complete the record.

PROFIT and LOSS (page 3)

Only for Intermediates and Senior Members Answer the four questions to complete this section. Please use complete sentences. Do not leave blank.

PHOTOGRAPHS from your 4-H PROJECT (Page 4) A minimum of four pictures with a descriptive caption for each is required. Pictures must be project-specific.

4-H STORY (page 4)

Follow the guidelines printed on page 5. Spend some time on your story it is very important.

Northern Colorado Meat Goat Breeders Scholarship

The Northern Colorado Meat Goat Breeders Inc. (NCMGB), also formerly known as the Weld County Meat Goat Breeders, will be awarding one or more \$500 scholarships, depending on availability of funds. These scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors or undergraduates furthering their education at a college, university, or trade school in the 2024-2025 academic year. These are the qualifications to be eligible to apply:

- Current or past member of a Weld County or Larimer County 4-H or FFA program.
- At some point in your 4-H or FFA career, prior to November 14, 2021, you purchased a market or breeding goat from a NCMGB member, and received a copy of our organization's "Market Goat Application" form, bill of sale, or proof of transfer, signifying your purchase from a member of our organization. You are also eligible if you raised the animal yourselves as a NCMGB member.
- Have not previously received a scholarship from our organization.

Weld County Farm Bureau Scholarship

Weld County Farm Bureau is pleased to announce their scholarship program for 2024. The program was established to support the future of agriculture by recognizing and rewarding deserving high school seniors and college students who plan to continue their education in an agriculture related field of study. Scholarships of \$1000 are available.

Applicants must be Weld County residents. The applicants whose parents, grandparents, or legal guardians are current members of Weld County Farm Bureau or are members in their own right, will be given higher priority.

Jonathan Marr 4-H Memorial Scholarship

West Greeley Conservation District Scholarship

West Greeley Conservation District (WGCD) would be honored to assist graduating high school students who are interested in furthering their education focused on Conservation, Agriculture, Environmental Sciences and related careers with our Scholarship.

Students who have earned a 3.0 GPA (or better), and are looking to continue their education at a Colorado college or university, may apply if their family pays the WGCD mil levy tax. To confirm eligibility - go to the Weld County Assessor's site at <u>https://apps.weld.gov/propertyportal/</u>, then enter your home address. If it lists WGCD in your Taxing Districts tab, your student may apply.

Dog ID Forms

All Dog ID Forms must be filled out by May 1st through 4-H Online this year. There are step-by-step instructions on how to fill out the Dog ID Form at <u>www.weld4h.org/projects</u>.

Dog Project

What do judges look for when judging Junior Showmanship?

- Does the dog and junior work as a team?
- Do both the dog and handler appear relaxed?
- Does the junior show the dog's "expression"?
- Does the junior show the dog according to its breed standards?
- Is the dog moving correctly?
- Does the junior show the dog's best qualities?
- Does the junior know where the judge is?
- Does the junior follow the judge's instructions correctly?
- Is the junior aware of their surroundings and maintaining proper spacing between their dog and others?
- Are they having fun?
- Is the junior smiling?

Cake Decorating Workshop

There will be a cake decorating workshop on Sunday, April 7th from 1:00-3:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley at Island Grove Park. Come join us for this fun learning experience.

Members in Unit 1 will need to bring a baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake. The cake can have a crumb coat on it. You will need to bring frosting for your cake and edible items to decorate with, a cake spatula, and a tall cup for hot water. You will learn how to bake a level cake, frost and smooth the frosting on your cake, and use edible items to decorate your cake.

Members in Unit 2 will need to bring a baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake. Members in Unit 3 will need to bring a two layered baked 8", 9" or 10" round or square cake.

Unit 4 will need to bring a character cake. Unit 5 will need to bring 4-12 cupcakes or cookies. Unit 6 will need to bring a baked cake to cut up and a knife. Units 2-10 may bring a frosted cake. You will need to bring frosting and all of your tips needed for the unit. You will learn how to use different tips specific for your unit.



Record all health related expenses such as veterinary/medical costs in this section. Remember to include the items from your health records page that you purchase. A cost must be in the total cost column as well as the project column that incurred that expense.

OTHER EXPENSE RECORD

Similar to the Feed Expense page in how you record your expenses, however this page is where you record all non-feed expenses. This might include, for example, veterinary or medical expenses, show entry fees, equipment purchases, transportation expenses, pen or barn rent, brand inspection fees, identification fees (ear tags, etc.), riding lessons, sale commissions, etc. Equipment that has been purchased in prior years should not be listed on this page. Those items will be on your beginning inventory – which we'll address in a future issue. Here is an example of a Non-Feed Expense record (note that if you have multiple projects you should keep the projects listed in the same order on all pages):

You can make as many copies of this page as needed for your record. Be sure to total all columns prior to turning in your record book.

Health Record

The Health Record is where you record all treatments administered for the health of your animal. This includes vaccinations, medications, **and** routine management practices such as dehorning, worming, fly control, tail docking, etc. Feeds containing medications should be listed here as well. It is preferred that you use a separate page for each project, but it is acceptable to list all projects on the same page. Be certain to write down the name and phone number of your veterinarian where it specifies. Below is an example of how you might fill out a health record.

Identification Form for Market Rabbit Project Members

This form, titled **DOE IDENTIFICATION FOR RABBIT MEAT PENS** <u>must be completed and filed with the</u> <u>Extension Office by May 1, 2024.</u>

If you are anticipating showing a meat pen of rabbits at the County Fair, please complete the <u>Doe Identification For Rabbit Meat Pen Form</u> by May 1, 2024.

New Livestock Family Programs

Premises ID

A premises identification number (PIN) or location identifier (LID) is a unique code that is permanently assigned to a single physical location. PIN or LID registration is administered by each State and allows animal health officials to quickly and precisely identify where animals are located in the event of an animal health or food safety emergency. A PIN or LID is required to purchase official animal identification tags.

If you move, the Premises ID stays with the property you are moving from and you will need to get a new Premises ID for your new home.

You can obtain a Premises ID at <u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/</u> aphis/ourfocus/animalhealth/traceability/state-pin/.

PID may be obtained by contacting the Colorado Department of Agriculture at 303-869-9130 or online at www.coloradodepartmentofagriculture/animals-ag.colorado.gov.

4-H Animal Care and Housing Form

All 4-H members with animal projects will be required to have a completed, signed and approved Animal Care and Housing Form for Colorado 4-H Livestock Projects form on file at the Extension Office. This form will be provided in two ways:

- 1. 4-H online for those that have their animals at their place of residence and on our 4-H Website <u>www.weld4h.org/</u> <u>projects/</u> for those that have their animals some place other than their residence. If your animal project is housed at your place of residence you can fill out this form while filling out your paperwork during the enrollment process online.
- 2. If your animal project is not housed at your place of residence then you will need to go to our 4-H Website, print the Animal Care and Housing form and fill out both sides of that form. This gives us additional information about your specific situation and helps with the approval process. Please give us detailed information or we will send them back for you to adjust your comments.

FFA Animal Care and Housing Form

All FFA members with animal projects are required to have a completed, signed and approved Animal Care and Housing Form for Colorado FFA Livestock Projects form on file at the Weld County Fair Office.

 FFA Members who want to show at the 2024 Weld County Fair must fill out and turn in an Animal Care and Housing Form by 5:00 p.m. on May 1, 2024 to the Weld County Extension Office to be eligible to show at the 2024 Weld County Fair. These forms will not be accepted via email. You can download the FFA Animal Care and Housing Form at <u>http://weldcountyfair.com/entries_events/</u> fair book entry forms.

DATES for Market Lamb, Market Goat & Market Swine ID Days

We will only have Sheep & Goat ID on 3 different days in 3 different locations.

- You will be given paperwork to fill out when you arrive at each location.
- Please fill out all paperwork before entering the barn at the Greeley Location. We will have two lines of vehicles in the livestock barn at a time at the Greeley Location.
- When you arrive at the Briggsdale location, you will receive paperwork, please filled it out before someone comes to your trailer to process.
- For Greeley & Briggsdale Locations: All animals will remain on their vehicle/trailer to be tagged and retinal scanned unless the retinal scanner asks you to unload and go to a separate pen.
- At Keenesburg, please bring your paperwork filled out when you bring your sheep and goats to the processing line.
- A scale will be available to weigh if you want to use it.
- Market Goats and Lambs showing at Southeast Weld County Fair will need to weigh-in on Thursday in Keenesburg to be considered for the rate of gain contest.

Market Swine

 All market swine exhibitors must pick up their ear tags and paperwork from the Extension Office beginning March 1st. Exhibitors will tag their own animals prior to the deadline. It is also a requirement that 3 photos be taken of each nominated pigs and attached to the nomination form. Mail in or hand deliver the nomination form and photos to the Extension Office by 5:00 pm on Thursday May 9, 2024, <u>there are no exceptions!</u> Nomination forms and pictures WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED VIA EMAIL. Detailed information is on the paperwork you pick up.

Cost is \$4/animal. Cash or check payable to Weld County Fair.

Breeding Animal ID Forms – <u>Required</u> This Year

We are requiring all members with breeding animals (Beef, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine) to fill out an ID Form in 4-H Online. We hope that many of you filled these forms out and submit them as we suggested last year, then this year you will just update them and re-submit the form and you are done. Regardless, this year you will need to fill out the Breeding Animal ID Forms by May 15th through 4-H Online. Please remember that you cannot nominate the same animal for market and breeding. Each breeding animal can only be nominated by only one member. There are step-by-step instructions on how to fill out the Breeding Animal ID Form on each species pages at <u>https://</u> www.weld4h.org/Projects.

Colorado State Fair Market Animal Information

Please see the important information regarding nominating market beef, goat, sheep and swine for the Colorado State Fair.

- Each animal must be ear tagged with the official recorded County ear tag. The official recorded County ear tag number must go on the Nomination Form as the permanent ear tag.
 ALL GOATS AND LAMBS MUST HAVE SCRAPIES TAGS.
- The Colorado State Fair will be using a hybrid identification procedure of retinal scans and DNA. It is the Fair's plan to eliminate retinal scans and utilize only DNA by 2025. You can order DNA envelopes beginning March 4th through May 20th at www.coloradostatefair.com. We do not have any DNA envelopes at the Extension Office. Market Swine will need to submit DNA. For Market Beef, Market Goat and Market Sheep, our office will be submitting retinal images.
- Each exhibitor nominating animals for the Colorado State Fair will complete one (1) form per species. Retinal scans may be attached to the beef, goat and lamb nomination forms; hog ear notches must be marked on the hog form. Weld County Extension Office will attached the retinal scans for beef, goat and lamb nominations.
- Hog exhibitors will be required to submit DNA samples for all hogs that may be entered and shown at the Colorado State Fair. Any beef, goat or lamb nominations that does not have retinal scans attached will be required to submit DNA. It is <u>required</u> that all market hogs shown at the 2024 Colorado State Fair, have proper ear notches, have an official recorded County / FFA ear tag and have submitted DNA within the required time limit. You can order DNA envelopes beginning March 4th through May 20th at <u>www.coloradostatefair.com</u>. Exhibitors will need to mail the DNA envelopes to Colorado State Fair and they are due by June 1st. Late DNA samples WILL NOT be accepted.
- One market hog ear notch change will be allowed per animal. Extension agents or FFA Advisors should submit any ear notch changes in writing to the Colorado State Fair – changes to ear notches will not be accepted via email or phone directly from exhibitors or parents. Incorrect ear notches may result in disqualification from showing at the Colorado State Fair. Pictures of ear notches are not acceptable.

At the time of nomination, all junior exhibitors may family/ household nominate all animals according to the following guidelines:

- The exhibitors must all legally reside in the same household and are siblings, step-siblings, or legally adopted.
- In order to properly family nominate an animal, <u>submit a</u> <u>separate nomination form for each exhibitor</u> and list every animal in each exhibitor's name.
- All exhibitors must sign the DNA sample envelope for market swine. We will attach retinal images for market beef, market goat and market sheep.
- The animal WILL NOT be family nominated if all exhibitors have not completed a nomination form and signed the DNA envelope for each animal.

The Colorado State Fair will be held August 23 - September 2. The tentative 2024 livestock schedule can be accessed at their website: <u>www.coloradostatefair.com</u>. You are encouraged to visit the website for a complete listing of rules.

Youth Meat Quality Assurance (YMQA) Certification

4-H & FFA members with MARKET and/or BREEDING livestock projects are required to complete Youth Meat Quality Assurance (YMQA) Certification. If you have never taken this program and did not take the program for a second time last year after you turned 14, you must attend a certification to be eligible to show at the Weld County Fair, Southeast Weld County Fair and Colorado State Fair. For the purposes of YMQA, **livestock** is defined as BREEDING AND MARKET BEEF, DAIRY, SHEEP, SWINE, GOATS, **RABBITS AND POULTRY.**

Horse projects are excluded from YMQA requirements.

Weld County members may complete certification in any county in the state. If attending in another county, please call their Extension Agent in advance to confirm your participation in their program and, find out specific time, location and directions to the training.

The Weld County MQA training will be held:

- March 26th from 4:00-7:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley
- March 27th from 4:00-7:00 pm in the 4-H Building, 527 N. 15th Avenue, Greeley

This training has several different stations that you will go through at your own pace. **Please be here no later than 6:00 pm to attend the training.**

If you are unable to attend the training in Weld County, it is your responsibility to attend a training in a different county. Please do not wait until the last minute to attend a training because choices become limited.

There will also be a virtual option in late spring or early summer that will only be valid for one year.


Breeding Exhibitors
